We would love for you to start a group! You can start your group by visiting <u>www.churchnativity.com/lead</u> oor text **LEAD** to 88877 and follow prompts. You can do that today or stop at Next Steps Kiosk during one of the weekend services and we can help. Please note we do comply with the background check process for all of the Archdiocese of Baltimore and will require you to provide references and complete the video training curriculum prior to serving.

The best way is to actually start a small group. If you have two friends, we can help you with everything you need to get started. If you'd rather do this in person, go to the Next Steps Kiosk and we can help you get plugged in. Next Steps to Growing Disciples

The heart of our church is to become growing disciples, who are giving the whole of our lives to God, not merely checking off boxes or going through the motions. So we are always challenging and encouraging the members of our church to take the next step that is the next step for them.

SERVE

We have been given unique gifts and talents by God. Using our gifts to serve in **Ministry** and **Missions** creates environments for others to experience God's presence on campus bringing God's love to other communities locally, nationally and internationally.

ITHE

We seek to honor God in all areas of life, and this includes our finances. As stewards, not owners, of the resources God has given us, we are called to **sacrificial giving**, which means percentage, progressive giving to the local church and the poor.

We believe faith grows in a circle. In **Small Groups**, we grow in fellowship and relationship with one another, God, and in ways we cannot grow on our own. Small Groups are where our big church gets small.

PRACTICE

Sample Invitations to Small Group

What are some ways we can invite those in our church community and those outside of our church community to check out small groups? Our approach to sharing our faith is simple:

- 1. Connect with the person you hope to invite to your small group.
- 2. Invest time and attention into this person, let them know they're loved.
- 3. Invite when the time is right.

Depending on who you want to invite, you can approach it differently based on their relationship with Nativity and church in general. This one pager will give you some helpful tips and sample invitation scripts.

To those in church, but not connected in Small Groups:

Every Tuesday, I spend about an hour with a group of people to talk about life, our challenges, and how our faith applies to our daily lives. It offers a new perspective on things and is so different from any other club or affiliation I've had before. We have members from all over now that online groups have grown popular on Zoom. You don't necessarily have to come to Nativity to be engaged in Nativity small groups. Would you be opposed to trying one week?

To friends and family not involved in churchworld:

Topic/Series Invite

I think Joe Flacco feels a lot of pressure to live up to his reputation on the Jets. It's tough to do your job when the expectations are so high. I was actually just talking about this phenomenon in my small group, because we are discussing a message series based on expectations. This message is about to wrap up, the next one will start next Tuesday. We have a couple seats open, good food and good conversation. How's your schedule on Tuesday?

Do you have any issue at work or home with people setting ridiculous expectations? My church teaches in what we call 'message series' where we talk about a topic for 4-6 weeks or so. It's been really cool to think about things in that intentional way. They also have pretty cool trailer videos and series name so the next one has car graphics in the look and called Redirecting Route. You should watch it online or come grab coffee with me and we can hang. The atmosphere there is super welcoming and clean!

Let's Just Hang

Every Tuesday, I grab coffee with a group of friends I met at church. We talk about our life and challenges. It's cool because they provide these videos to get our conversation started. I know you are not usually involved in church world but it can still be valuable to discuss life and challenges with good people. We meet at (meeting time). Why don't you stop by?
