Instructions

The group checkpoint is designed to evaluate where your group is today and how the group can make adjustments so that each member continues to grow in faith and fellowship.

What does group success look like? People are growing in faith and are experiencing authentic community. These are the 2 areas that will be evaluated in the CheckPoint.

- Growing in faith members are taking steps towards balancing the 5 biblical purposes for our lives: prayer & worship, discipleship, fellowship, serving, and sharing your faith.
- Authentic Community members openly share their lives with each other, care for one another, and feel a sense of safety and belonging.

Each group member should fill out the CheckPoint and then the group can discuss together.
