SCRIPTURE MARK 3:32-35

His mother and his brothers arrived. Standing outside they sent word to him and called him. A crowd seated around him told him, “Your mother and your brothers* [and your sisters] are outside asking for you.” But he said to them in reply, “Who are my mother and [my] brothers?” And looking around at those seated in the circle he said, “Here are my mother and my brothers. [For] whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother.”

4. How do the priorities of God’s kingdom, as illustrated in the Gospel passage from Mark, align with your priorities and actions in everyday life?
5. Considering the impact made in Kiu, Kenya, how do you see the ripple effect of helping one community on neighboring areas and future generations?
