2. Read aloud Mark 8:31-32a. As you understand it, why did Jesus have to die to bridge the gap between God and humanity? Why was it a must that he went to the cross?
3. Through the cross, Jesus bridged the gap between God and humanity. What does this teach us about the lengths God will go to unite with us?
4. How can Jesus, bridging the gap between you and God, inspire you to build bridges with people you disagree with?
5. Where do you need to die to yourself or sacrifice to build unity with others?
6. Do you hear people you agree with put down people you disagree with? What would it look like for you to correct or admonish them?
